- April 1 Soul Masters** -*Video*-In China, it is said that Dr. Guo can cure the incurable. When his representative in the West, Dr. Sha, heals her ailing father, an American filmmaker follows his return to China to visit his mentor. At Dr. Guo's clinic, she captures first-ever footage of breakthrough medical practices involving herbal medicine, fire massage and self-healing techniques. Dr. Sha returns to the States and his teachings spread across North America and Europe. Expanding on Dr. Guo's work, he teaches people the revolutionary discovery that binds these two Soul Masters: everything has a soul, and the soul can heal.  
Doris Swalec will be the facilitator for the evening.
- April 8 Sacred Activism and Social Democracy** -*Video* - Andrew Harvey discusses Sacred Activism, which is the fusion of the deepest mystical knowledge and passion with wise focused radical action in the world. Special attention will be paid to the great evolutionary mystics Sri Aurobindo and Father Bede Griffiths, both of whom not only achieved enlightenment but grounded that enlightenment in increasingly divinized bodies.  
Andrew Harvey was born in India and schooled in England, the youngest Fellow ever at Oxford University. His book, *A Journey in Ladakh*, sold 60,000 copies and won the Christmas Humphreys Prize. Harvey is coauthor of *Perfume of the Desert* (with Eyrk Hanut) and is a celebrated translator of Rumi. He lives in Las Vegas, Nevada. - April 15 The Dice Game of Shiva** -*Video* - Richard Smoley explains the story of Shiva's dice game, in which the god always loses to his divine consort, is one of the most profound yet most baffling of Hindu myths. The myth explains the dynamic between purusha (consciousness) and prakriti (the world). What does this mean in terms of moment-to-moment life? The speaker also leads a guided meditation to give some direct experience of these teachings.

- April 22 Mystical Easter** -*Lecture* - Don Elwert will lecture on the Epiphysical View of the Wisdom tradition with metaphysical questions and answers.
- April 29 What is Enlightenment** -*Video* - John Cianciosi. In every spiritual tradition there is an ideal that the aspiring practitioner strives for. In Buddhism this ideal is enlightenment, and realizing it is the goal of practice. By better understanding the nature of this goal, we will know the direction in which we wish to grow spiritually.  
John Cianciosi was born in Italy and educated in Australia. In 1972, he was ordained a Buddhist monk in Thailand and trained under one of that country's most gifted and influential meditation masters, the late Venerable Ajahn Chah. Ron Lienweber will be facilitator for the evening.
