Doors open at 6:30 p.m. **Movies begin promptly at 7:00 p.m.** From 6:30 to 6:55 is time for socializing, browsing through the bookstore and library and enjoying light refreshments.

Nov 2 Movie – Archetypal Forms and Forces

Archetypal energies beckon us to live a larger life. We are all healers, warriors, visionaries and teachers – but often these potentials remain in latent form. Through song, dance, storytelling and meditation we can activate these archetypes. Angeles Arrien, Ph.D., a cross-cultural anthropologist, is on the faculty of the California Institute of Integral Studies and the Institute of Transpersonal Psychology.

Nov 9 Movie – Archetypal Psychology

Carl Jung's concept of synchronicity, an acausal principle, connects the ego to the larger archetypal self. This connection is like the ancient Chinese concept of the Tao in that it cannot be rationally understood. Jean Shinoda Bolen suggests that the images of the ancient dieties represent powerful projections of the psyche. By studying the myths of the gods, we can learn much about ourselves. It is by facing the truth of our lives that we can die to our past ways and enter into a new order of being.

Nov 16 Movie – Unity of Man and Nature

In this far ranging talk, Rolling Thunder contrasts this with the notion of mankind as dominator over nature. He describes the natural powers of native peoples which emerge from an attunement with nature. These include the ability to communicate with plants and animals, telepathic interactions with each other, and the ability to make rain. He describes his role as a healer using shamanistic methods and also describes his journeys to the worlds of spirits.

Nov 30 Movie - Meditation #1 and #2: Dialogue #17 and #18

Krishnamurti constantly emphasized the right *place of thought* in daily life. But he also pointed out the dangers of thought as knowledge and mental images when it operates in relationships. This two-part movie (filmed in 1974) depicts a discussion between Krishnamurti and Allen Anderson on the many aspects of meditation.

Dec 7 Movie – Meditation: The Inward Journey

This film is vintage Alan Watts. In this video he explores various techniques created through the ages for the journey inward: the Hindu use of a mantra, the Christian use of prayer, the Buddhist use of silence, the Sufi use of dance. Alan Watts was a philosopher, writer, speaker, and expert in comparative religion. He was best known as an interpreter and popularizer of Asian philosophies for a Western audience.

Dec 14 Movie – Brother Sun Sister Moon

St. Francis of Assisi was an extraordinarily complex and difficult figure whose effect on his contemporary society was electrifying. Francesco renounces the riches, his family and starts to rebuild the Church as "il Poverello - the poorest of the poor." Even today, many people are moved by his visionary message of universal toleration.

Dec 21 Movie – Dharma, The Law of Our Best Being

Dharma is a Sanskrit term sometimes translated as duty to truth or to spiritual law. But how does one access spiritual truth and freely live by it? Find out as we explore the value of living a Theosophical life.

The Flowering Tree Lodge

Debbie Mast is co-leader of the Flowering Tree Lodge in Michigan and the founder of the Women's Hoop, a ceremonial group for women, now in its sixteenth year. Her work is inspired by her vision of women and men working together to re-create the world.

The Flowering Tree Lodge is a teaching lodge of The Sweet Medicine Sun Dance tradition. This tradition was founded in 1250 B.C. by medicine women and men from tribes across the Americas. Calling themselves Twisted Hairs, they braided together *knowledge that works* from every direction on the Wheel of Life. Over time they developed tremendous amounts of knowledge about energy, ceremonial alchemy, healing techniques, communication with nature and controlled dreaming. The Twisted Hairs opened their teachings to non-natives in the 1970's. The local Sweet Medicine community gathers to learn and share together, as they reach for their highest potential.

This group meets at our building several times throughout the year. People interested in learning more about the Sweet Medicine tradition are invited to come to monthly open houses held March-September. These include a sweat lodge ceremony.
