11/11 Meditations from Shankara: Ode to the South-Facing Form

It is difficult for spiritual wisdom to flow into a drifting mind. We can be helped to develop an attentive mind through regular meditation. This evening, we will reflect on a series of nine-hymn meditations called "The Meditation on the South-Facing Form," by Shri Shankaracharya, who taught ways of acquiring a mature, spiritually evolved mind. Through such practices, a new state of awareness can be experienced in union with the Glorious Presence.

Ron Leinweber leads the Thursday evening meditation at the Theosophical Society. He is a life-long spiritual seeker and a student of world religions. A member of the lodge for many years, he is also a trained meditator. A retired high school and college teacher of literature, he currently leads three meditation groups in the Detroit area. He is a commissioned Benedictine oblate, who is inclusive in his study and has high regard for the essential truth in all spiritual traditions. Ron is currently completing an internship leading to certification as a spiritual director.

11/ 18 Buddhist Practices That Help Us Lose Fear In Our Lives

Rev. Wetara Mahinda

Rev. Mahinda will talk on the role of fear in our lives in general, some observations on specific instances of damage that it is likely to cause us, and some applicable guidelines to reduce fear in the light of Buddhist teachings.

Rev. Mahinda, who is currently on leave in the U.S., is a senior lecturer in the Department of Archaeology in Sri Lanka. He has spoken on several topics in Buddhism including Buddha Dharma, Buddhist psychotherapy, and Buddhist problem-solving at Kaula Lumpur, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Hong Kong, India, Germany, and the U.S.

11/25 The Two Hands of God

Dr. Richard Brooks

The so-called "problem of evil" has been one of the major concerns for Judeo-Christian theology: how could an omnipotent, omni-benevolent Being create a world in which diseases and natural disasters regularly kill, disable, or economically disadvantage thousands of apparently innocent people every year? Dr. Brooks contends that orthodox theology cannot satisfactorily answer this question, but that theosophy can.

Dr. Richard Brooks is an emeritus professor of philosophy from Oakland University where he taught a variety of subjects for 33 years. He has been a member of The Theosophical Society for over 50 years and has lectured widely in several countries as well as throughout the U.S. In Fall of 1998, he served as the Director of the School of Wisdom at the International Headquarters of the TS in India and has been asked to return as Director again next year.

12/2 Taoism: Philosophy or Religion? Winnie Wong

Winnie will speak about the Taoism (the path), which emphasizes consciousness (Tao) as the source of all beings, provide a short review of the Tao Te Ching (The Law of Virtue and its Way), and the influence of Taoism today.

Winnie Wong, a Chinese American, is currently a second year Intern in the Ignatian Spirituality Program in Manresa, Bloomfield Hills and will be commissioned as a Spiritual Director upon completion of this program. Winnie speaks English and four Chinese dialects, including Mandarin and Cantonese. Winnie has taught high school and college students, and retired recently as an adjunct Professor of Theology. A free-lance interpreter and translator in metropolitan Detroit, one of her favorite hobbies is translating Chinese poetry. Winnie is a mother of five children and grandmother of three. She is a Roman Catholic and a Christian Meditator, who studies the tradition of the Tao in ancient China.

12/9 Dhikr — A Heart-warming Sufi Practice Denise Salaam Marsico

Denise will speak on the practice of "Dhikr" or remembrance as a way to bring us back to God and the highest truth. She will also show us how to open, cleanse, and purify our hearts so that we can know ourselves deeply. The Dhikr is a spiritual practice that nourishes the soul in Sufi Islam.

Denise Salaam Marsico has been practicing Sufism for over four years, and is a Master level Sufi teacher and healer. A graduate of the Jaffe Institute, she is currently an assistant teacher at the School of Spiritual Healing and Sufism.


12/23 Inner Meaning of Christmas

Book Review

Letters from the Masters of the Wisdom, Series 1 edited by C. Jinarajadasa

The Masters whom Theosophy presents to us are members of our own evolutionary group, not visitants from the celestial spheres. They are supermen only in that they have attained knowledge of the laws of life and mastery over its forces with which we are still struggling. They are the "just men made perfect," who have pressed forward to attain the fullness of the stature of Christ, the prize of the high calling of God in Christhood. They are not Gods come down to earth, but earthly mortals risen to the status of Christs.

They ask from us no reverence, no worship; they demand no allegiance but that which it is expected we shall render to the principles of Truth and Fact, and to the nobility of life. They are our "Elder Brothers," not distant deities; and will even make their presence known to us and grant us the privilege of cooperating with them when we have shown ourselves capable of working unselfishly for mankind.

They are not our Masters in the sense of holding lordship over us; they are the "Masters of Wisdom and Compassion."
